Dear Mr. Willis,

I am writing to formally express our concerns about the impact of the submarine cables that Revolution Wind is proposing to install in the West Passage of Narragansett Bay (CRMC File No.: 2021-07-005). We operate lease # 13-04-057 in the West passage adjacent to the proposed submarine cables. We grow oysters for American Mussel Harvesters, Inc (AMH) a Rhode Island corporation established in 1986. AMH has developed a national market for the trade marked brands of oysters we grow for them. Interruptions in the supply would cause AMH to lose these customers.

In addition, we are a contract grower of kelp for Atlantic Sea Farms of Maine. In two sections of our contract with them the adverse impact of sediments on the kelp blades is addressed. In another section the impacts of heavy metals on the value of the crop are highlighted.

We want to formally express our concern about sedimentation, heavy metals and electromagnetic fields that could adversely impact our oyster and kelp farming activities.
