To the members of the Coastal Resources Management Council:

I write today to voice my strong support for Ørsted and Eversource's proposed Sunrise Wind project, an approximately 924-megawatt offshore wind farm with the potential capacity to power nearly 600,000 homes. This proposal is coming from well-established, experienced leaders in the global offshore wind industry – two companies who have consistently proven to deliver on their promises of creating jobs and economic activity.
